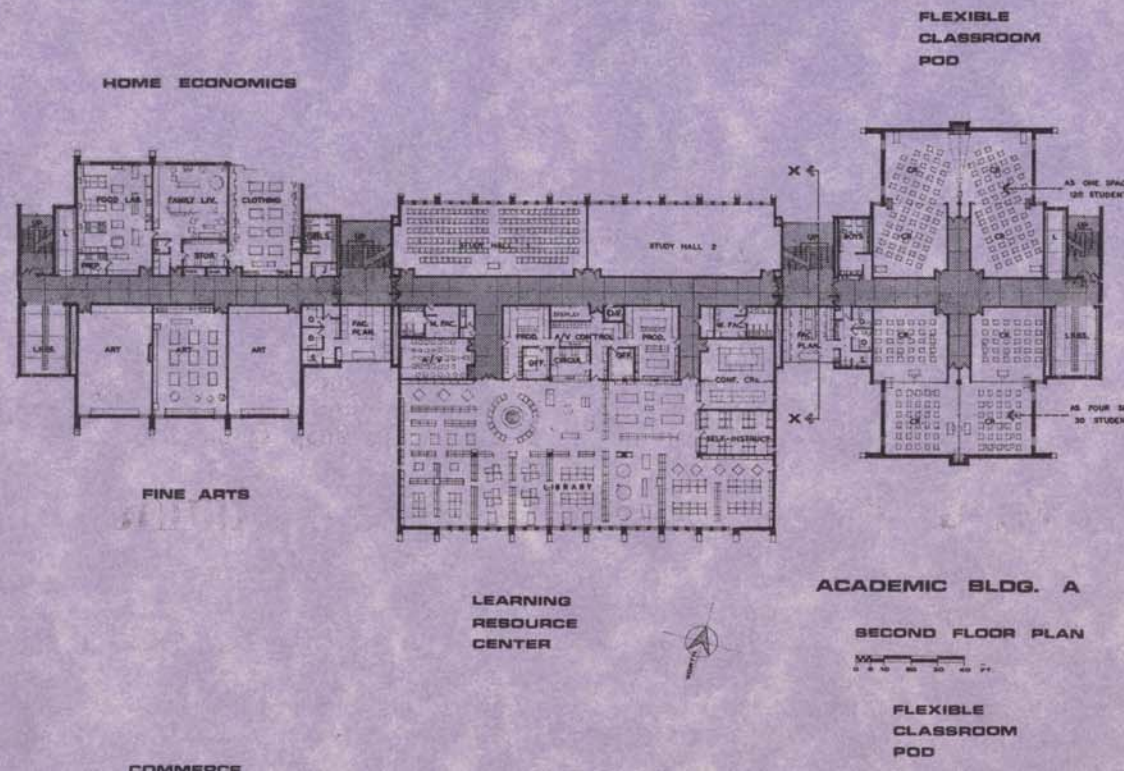

BUILDING DESIGN AND FINANCIAL DATA

Prime considerations of design:

1. Future expansion—Initial construction is designed for future expansion. Certain features of the present buildings are designed for conversion into another use when future phases of construction are completed.
2. Flexible use of space: We are in a time of fast changing curricular and educational needs and changing concepts in educational methods. The flexible space feature of this facility will enable it to adapt the changing curriculum and instructional methods.
3. Economy of maintenance and operation—The design of the building has taken into consideration economy of maintenance and economy of operation. The building is designed to be functional at each stage or phase in the construction.

Key Design Features:

1. Elimination of doors swinging into corridors by use of recessed classroom entry.
2. Reduction of corridor congestion by providing locker alcoves instead of having lockers lined along corridors.
3. Grouping of non-academic functions (administrative, guidance, and health suites) easily accessible, with separate entrances for visitors, faculty, etc., but connected by interior corridor to main building corridor.
4. Flexible classroom "pods" four classrooms grouped together for

team teaching in various combinations (two classrooms, three classrooms, four classrooms).

5. Faculty planning rooms consisting of private offices for department heads and small desk and file cabinet for each teacher. Providing teachers with a work area during preparation periods will allow greater classroom utilization.
6. Learning resource center: 25,000-volume library, expandable to 50,000 volumes by expanding into temporary study hall area. Library area, and related spaces will accommodate 300 students, with major emphasis on self-instruction through a wireless system of "dial a program" to carrell stations. A tape control area (12 to 24 channels) will transmit programs as required throughout the entire academic building. Complete production and resource work areas—including preview room, conference and seminar rooms, offices, darkroom and faculty library—are included in the total design of the LRC.
7. Dining facilities for students and faculty will temporarily be a portion of the gymnasium building. A transportable food serving operation has been designed using mobile service equipment with a warming kitchen back-up. A 3-line scramble serving line, together with a vending machine area, will serve over 2,000 students in 4 feeding periods. Dining area provides space using portable folding tables for 500 students.
